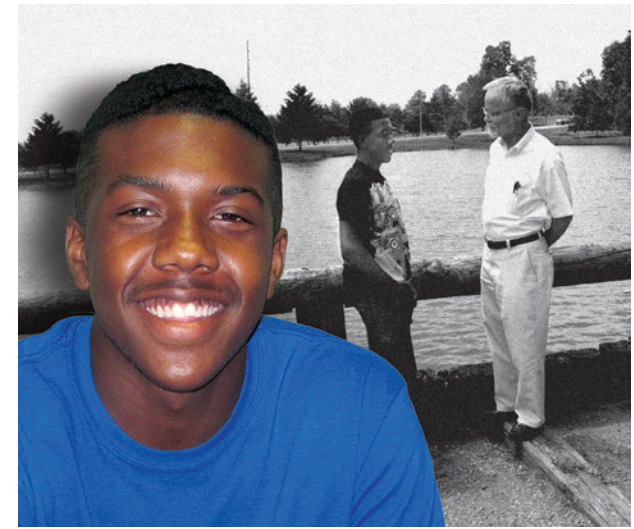
TIFFANY
