Several of our Volunteer groups were helpful to complete the All Abilities Playground prior to the Allen County Board of DD's return to school and the playground dedication.

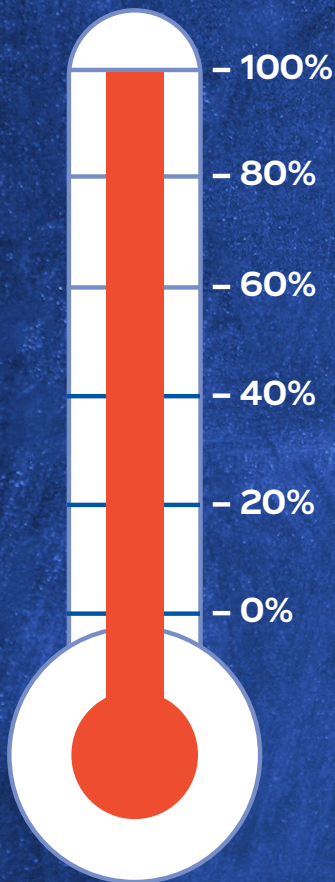

Crime Victim Services (CVS), Victim Court Advocacy assists victims of crime with four core needs: safety, healing, justice, and restitution. All services, such as court accompaniment, court hearing notices, safety planning, emergency money, crisis counseling, and information and referral are provided to any victim of crime free of charge.

CVS' Prevention Program provides culturally appropriate educational curriculum to youth and adults in our community with the express purpose of preventing relationship violence and cultivating a culture where consent and respect for one another is a central tenet. CVS partners with local schools and agencies to facilitate the curriculum.

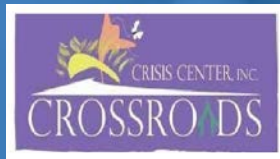
